



## Cookie Policy for [www.ctt.se](http://www.ctt.se)

CTT website use cookies to provide users with an enhanced experience when browsing and also to allow us to improve our websites.

### Which cookies are we using?

**Analytical/performance cookies:** These cookies provide generic statistics on the use of our website by allowing us to recognise and count the number of visitors and to see how they move around the site. This helps us to improve the way our sites work, for example, by ensuring that users find what they are looking for easily. We use [Google Analytics](#) for this purpose.

**Functionality cookies:** These are used to recognise you when you return to our website, so that, for example, your last view of any slideshow is saved or the homepage defaults to the correct version depending on your preferences (for example, your choice of screen view).

### How long will the cookies remain?

The length of time for which any cookie remains on your device will depend on its type:

**Session Cookies:** These are temporary cookies, which only exist in the period you access the site.

**Persistent Cookies:** These are cookies which remain on your device after you have visited the site. These cookies help us to identify if you are a first time or frequent visitor.

Our sites use a mixture of both session and persistent cookies.

### How do I disable or refuse cookies?

Most browsers are set to accept cookies, but you can alter this should you prefer. Your navigation of some of our sites may be less efficient if your browser is set to disable cookies.

Nevertheless, if you wish to restrict or block the cookies which are set by us, or indeed any other website, the 'Help' function within your browser should assist. For information on how to control cookies on the browser of your mobile device, you will need to refer to your handset manual.
